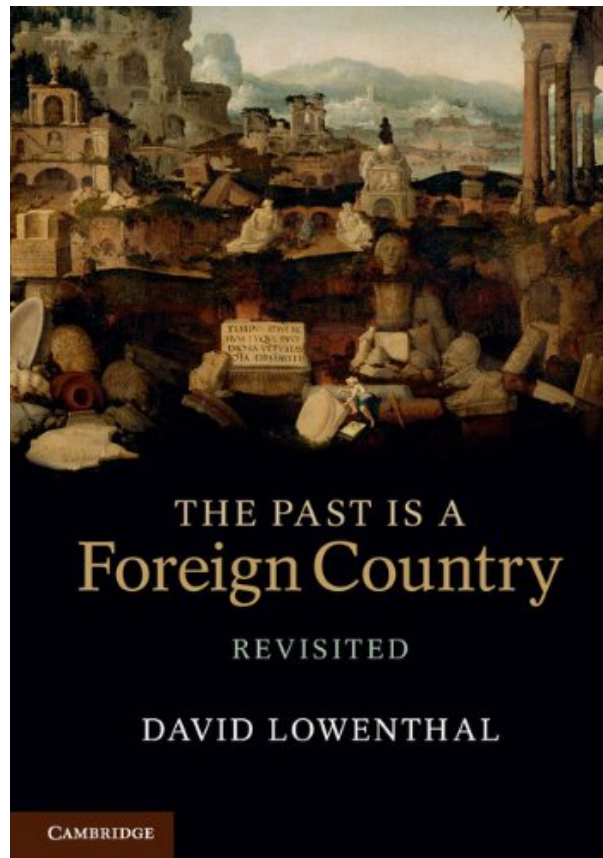
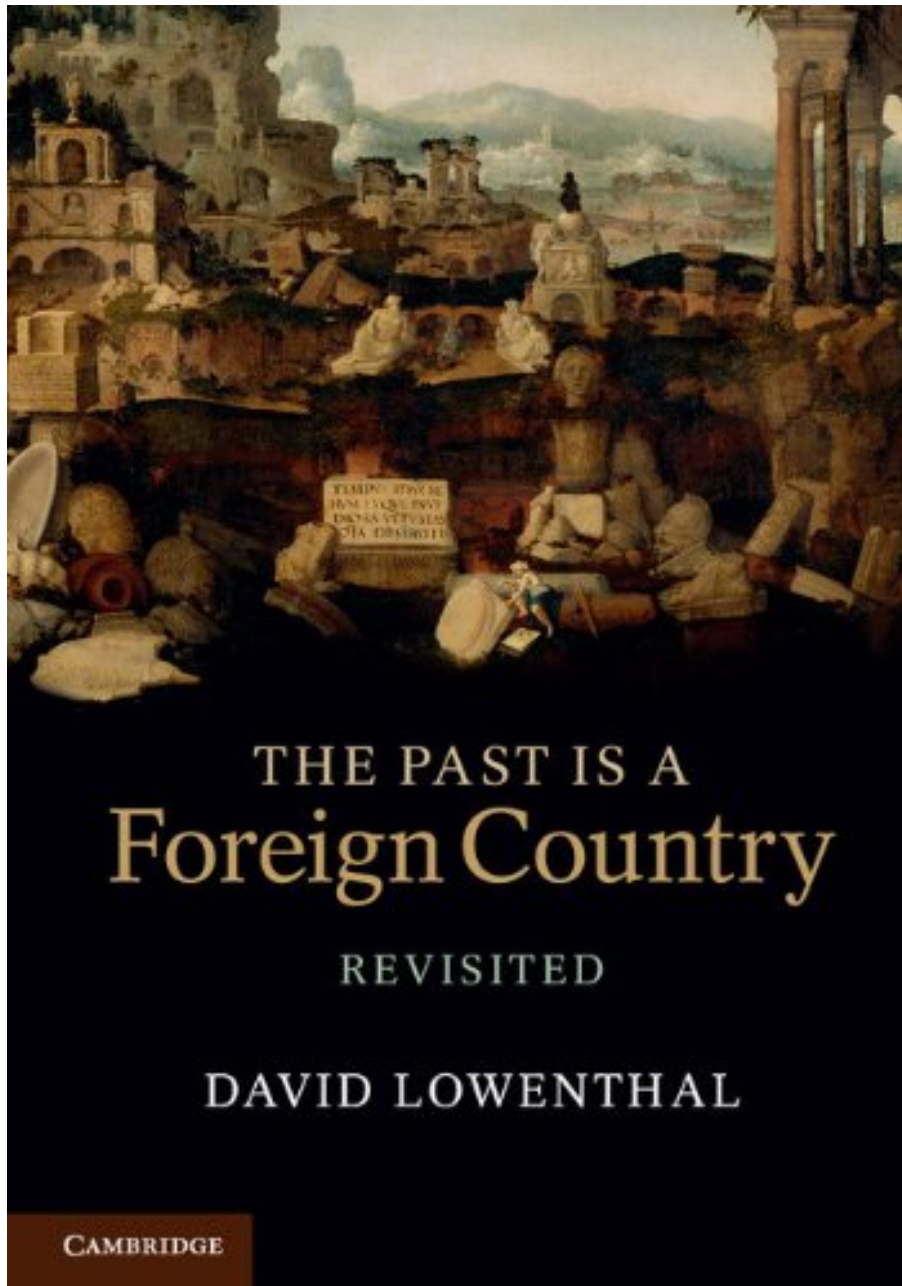

Lowenthal needed a much more severe editor. This tome is smart, stylish and stuffed with interesting and relevant references, but reads as a breathlessly rambling, tediously repetitive accumulation of information rather than a sustained, well wrought argument. I would suggest a 3rd revisitation that overhauls and

compresses the outline, edits out the mass of less compelling details, and elaborates the most significant examples in enough depth to truly illustrate his main points. Otherwise, so many of Lowenthal's scholarly tidbits merely evaporate rather than sink in. For a book that runs more than 600 pages, it feels frustratingly superficial.
